

JUNE TECH SESSION

The June Tech session was supposed to be a demonstration of the smart phone app TiKL Touch to Talk. This app is a Push to Talk or walkie talkie app. My intent was to give our members a tool that could be used in place of CB radios when three or more members were caravaning to a destination.

Cb radios have a very limited range when attached to our mostly fiberglass motorhomes. It is easy to get separated by too many miles or hills when traveling in a group. Short of convincing all of our members to earn a HAM radio license, I think walkie-talkie apps may be our best tool. With a push to talk app, multiple contacts can all talk as if they were on one radio channel as long as they have a good cellular data signal and distance is irrelevant since the cell network is doing all of the heavy lifting.

TiKL was to be the first in a group of three apps that I found that might fit our needs. However, on my phone and my 'beta' testers' phones in the weeks preceding the rally TiKL worked so well that I decided to devote all of my research time to this one app. When the attendees of the Tech Session tried to install the app I found out that I had not tested a broad enough group of phones. Pandemonium resulted. I never really got a handle on why our members had so much trouble with TiKL.

On the plus side, the session generated a lot of interest and I hope that our members will continue to experiment with these type of apps. I have already received word that the VOXer app seems to work better on iPhones, or at least some models, than TiKL.

Since iPhone users out number Android users in our membership by a large factor, perhaps members traveling to the high country this summer should try the VOXer app.

JUNE 17, 2015 Business Meeting June 13, 2015

President Jeannette Idell called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Jeannette reported that the minutes of the last meeting were published in the April 2015 Newsletter. Darrell Gilliland moved that we approve the minutes of the last meeting. It was seconded and carried.
