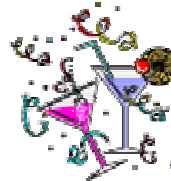

The October Tech Session covered Windows 7 computer file naming and organization. Windows operating system tends to save the files you create or receive in a few broad categories. You often end up with so many similar names in a single folder that you have trouble finding the one you are looking for when you need to access it later. Windows 7 has a new feature that can help with this called Libraries. When first installed Windows 7 Libraries have four folders, Documents, Pictures, Music, and Videos. Each of these folders have two sub-folders such as, My Documents and Public Documents. You need to create sub-folders inside the four main folders and name them in a manner that helps you remember where to look for a particular file.

A good example would be to place sub-folders in the Pictures library called Family and another called Friends. A good sub-folder name in the Friends folder would be RRR for all of your photos of our rallies. Windows knows that files placed in the Pictures main folder should be made visible as Thumbnail pictures and the same is true of the Videos main folder. Most modern digital cameras are able to take both still photos and video, unfortunately, when you download photos from your camera to your computer you usually end up with the videos and the stills mixed together in the Pictures folder. If you make the sub-folder structure of the Pictures and Video the same, then it is easy to open a window of each designation and drag the videos from the Pictures folder that they are in the the Videos folder of the same designation. There are a number of reasons that you don't want videos mixed in with your still photos in the same folder, but the most aggravating problem it causes is when you try to play a slide show of stills. Many times the video won't play and will freeze or crash the slide show, but even if it does play and doesn't crash the slide show program, it is not likely that you would like the effect of a video in the middle of a slide show.

There are no hard and fast rules governing how you organize your files. What makes sense to me may not work for you. Play with it. Make it your own. You will be surprised how much easier it is to find your files with just a little extra time and effort.
